

# Creating a Macintosh computer screen saver

With just a few simple steps, you can display your favorite pictures as a screen saver slide show on your Macintosh computer.

Creating a screen saver on a Macintosh OS X system

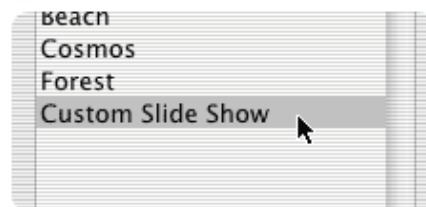
1 - Click System Preferences in the Dock.



2 - Click the Screen Saver icon in the Personal section.



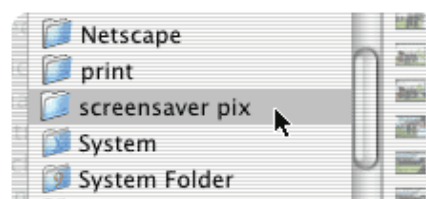
3 - Select Custom Slide Show from the Screen Saver list.



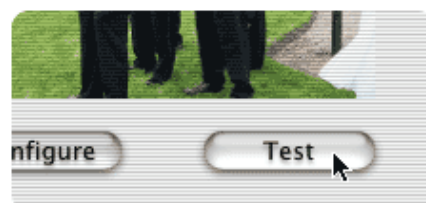
4 - Click Configure.



5 - Navigate to your folder of pictures and select it. The slideshow displays your pictures in a multimedia fashion with dissolves and zoom features in the Preview window.



6 - Click the Test button to preview how your screen saver slide show will look.



7 - Click the Activation tab to set the delay before the screen saver will appear. Delay times may be as short as five minutes or as long as 60 minutes.

Note: You may want to resize your digital picture to match your monitor's screen resolution. If you don't, some tiling or distortion of the picture will take place. For example, if your monitor is set to display at a width of 1024 pixels and a height of 768 pixels, resize your image to that resolution by using your photo-editing software.
